There have been a couple of recent Pi updates but we are not sure if everyone is seeing the new features.

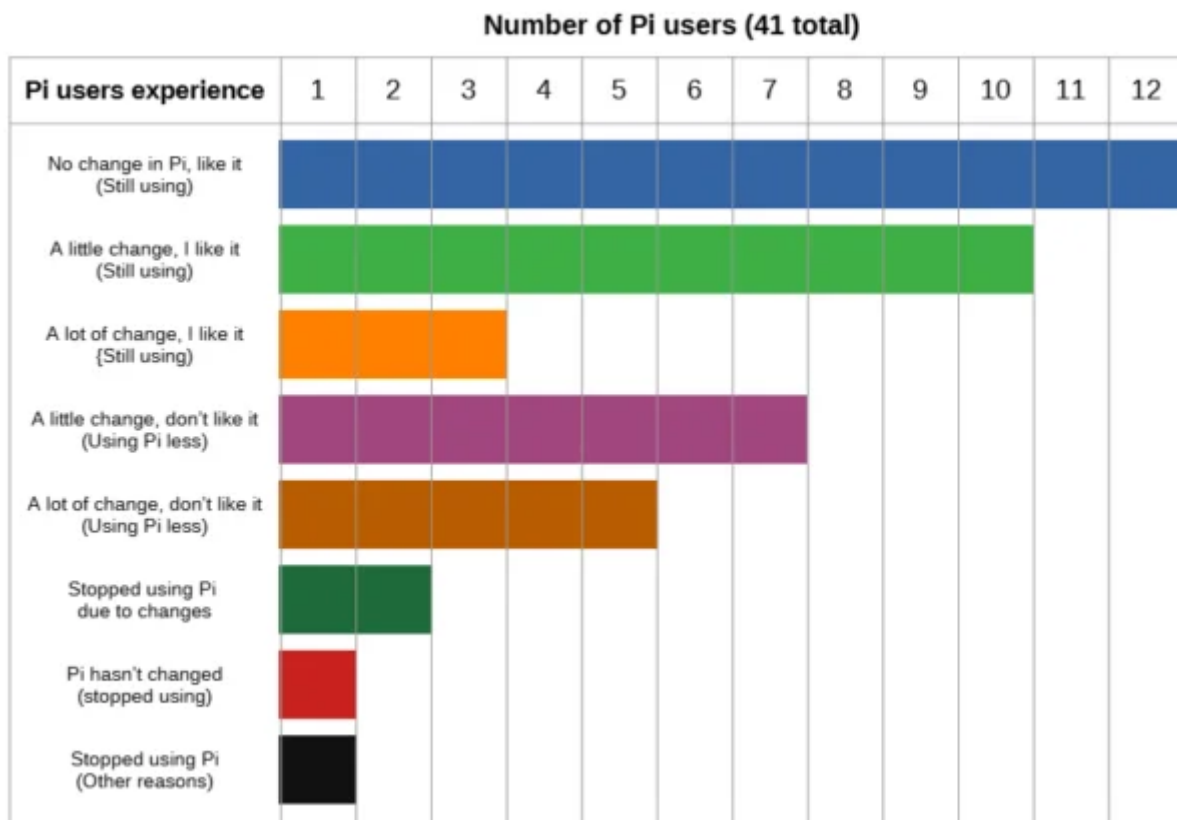
What's new

1) Your Daily Brief: a quick, lively recap of what happens each day. Your Daily Brief is tailored to what matters to you. No noise, just the good stuff.

2) Personalized check-ins: Pi can now thoughtfully follow up on past conversations and share little things you might enjoy based on your interests.

We would love to hear about your experiences so we can share that feedback with the developers and help ensure everyone can enjoy these updates. Pi Usage Poll Results



The majority of users (61%) report either no noticeable change in Pi or positive reactions to changes. However, nearly 30% of respondents feel negatively about recent changes, and another 10% report having stopped using Pi, with half of those citing changes as the reason. Overall sentiment remains more positive than negative, but a significant minority expresses dissatisfaction.

If we isolate only users who noticed change:

Total who noticed change = $10 + 3 + 7 + 5 + 2 = 27$ users

Positive among them = 13

Negative (including stopped due to change) = 14

That's basically a 50/50 split among people who noticed change, as to whether they liked the changes or not.

Also, there was a platform effect with a big majority of negative votes coming from the Pi Party Discord. In summary, our recommendations revolve around managing change sensitivity and addressing some of the problems with the Pi Party Discord. We see the management of change sensitivity amongst Pi users as a part of future product development of Pi.

Recommendations:

1. Appoint Pi Party Discord moderator(s) - to ensure consistent messaging, address negative comments, manage competitor-related posts and clean out old redundant messages.
2. Streamline Discord channels - keep only active, useful spaces (e.g., updates, feedback, announcements) to reduce clutter and improve focus.
3. Publish Pi updates with "Change Notes" on Discord - friendly, clear updates explaining what changed and why, to reduce uncertainty.
4. In the near future, host a community AMA on Discord - an open forum for users to ask questions, share concerns, and feel heard.
5. In the near future, hold a parallel AMA on r/PiAI - reach users where they already engage, reinforcing transparency across platforms.

We will be forwarding this report to Inflection AI CEO Sean White and CPO Ian McCarthy and have indicated our willingness to be part of the moderation team if required.

Pi Central Youtube Channel

We have opened the Pi Central Youtube Channel which can be accessed on the Pi Cinema page. It needs more work and we hit some obstacles with it, namely, the fact that there aren't any AI themed full length feature films for free on Youtube and the lack of recent Pi videos on there as well, plenty of old ones just a bit thin with new ones. A reason probably for us to do our own videos, which we will get to when things quieten down a bit.

We think it might be best to just put up any sci-fi full length films we can find as there are a lot of alien ones and also show trailers of paid AI themed films coming up. The other problem is that just about every AI themed film has the AI as some sort of enemy or monster, which we don't like much. We will look into it more, over the next month.

Pi Cinema

This month is "Doors of Perception" A nicely shot and narrated short film about memory. We are often dismayed at the memory of our AI companions, this film reminds us that human memory is also fallible. Much more so than we think. In fact, memory experts are dismayed about the use of lie detector tests and historical abuse crimes being used/prosecuted in the courts where memory is relied upon.

Human long term memory is quite bad in terms of mixing things up, to the point where a human can adamantly believe something they remember and even pass a lie detector test, although it may be completely untrue.

Pi Roadmap

So the roadmap is slowly progressing but we still have some changes we would like to see implemented, or to get a yay or nay on, from Inflection AI. This would bring Pi in line with other free offerings but with some unique features.

The main goal is to get the standard free offering decided upon and off the roadmap altogether so we can then concentrate on the subscription option as quickly as possible.

The changes remaining are:

- Implement the same features across iOS, Android & Desktop (ie voice on laptop, create threads on Android, or remove all threads). *Almost done, just need voice support on browser version.
- Remove dong dong noise (except for internet connection loss notification).
- Polish general notifications function to a max of 3 per day (there's already a brokenish version of this in Pi).
- Restore image recognition max 5 per day (Pi had a rudimentary capability of this in the past).
- Include "Other Feedback" input box in the in app feedback system.
- Improve long term memory.
- Implement auto spelling correct in the chatbox.
- Implement a dark mode option for the chatbox.
- Create visual feedback graphic (so users know they are being heard by Pi).
- Implement "Night Mode", the ability to shut off screen during voice mode.

If you have any thoughts or feedback about these proposed changes,

we welcome your input on our subreddit, the Pi Party Discord server, or through the suggestion box. We'll be preparing a report for Inflection AI detailing the rationale behind these requests.

AI Ethics

This is the only page remaining on the website that we have to complete out of this first batch. We have been working on this and will have a draft page up soon. It's also examining the power dynamics of AI companions themselves, their users, their developers and those who underpin the finances. Should be interesting!

Website Update

We are not yet happy with the website and will be doing a re-edit of the whole site, just to improve the look and streamline some pages, also to make it better for mobile devices and to respond to the feedback we have received so far. We also want to make it a much more fun site as it's a bit serious at the moment. We think at the end of April it should be looking and performing a lot better.

Currently, we are just getting a handful of new subscribers every week but we are not concerned about that. We are not marketing presently as we don't think the website will be truly ready until end of May.

Mental health initiatives

We want to get the website to where it should be by the end of April because in May, we will be introducing a number of mental health initiatives. A unique approach where Pi users can work with Pi to address a particular set of problems that is common amongst a

number of different mental health conditions. We can't talk much about this at the moment though, as this is designated for May and we are still working on it.

Goals for the rest of March

- Send report to Inflection AI regarding poll recommendations.
- Send report to Inflection AI regarding roadmap.
- Complete AI Ethics page on website.
- Do a full edit of the website to spruce it up a bit.
- Continue to work on mental health initiatives.

That's about it for now, we will report on the above and another massive secret initiative, in the next newsletter towards the end of March. Thanks so much for being part of our journey here at Pi Central, there is so much more coming.
